ACTING PRESIDENT Shirley Pitt's WELCOME

I'd like to thank our second vice president Mary Stary for taking the chair of LAS while I was on a lovely holiday in Mid West America . I did however manage to find many interesting art spaces along the way to visit. Beginning in Chicago, an internationally recognised art hub, I visited the 'Art Institute of Chicago" and viewed from their collection, many great works from world renowned artists. The city is a vibrant art city and has many art districts featuring more contemporary and emerging artists . Although time restrictions only allowed me to visit one of these areas, it was an insight into less traditional art. A river boat excursion was a highlight with an exceptional guide giving us details of the cities architectural design and history. My most enjoyable experiences were in the small local communities and their art galleries. I stumbled across an Art Fair in a local park, a street art market in a lovely lakeside town and many small community galleries run by volunteers.

They were so interested to hear about our art society, its history and events. A philanthropic project in the town of Grand Rapids Michigan took my breath away . Frederik Meijer Botanical Gardens, Art museum and Sculpture Park. The feature being a bronze horse created by the famed animal sculptor Nina Akamu. It stand 7.35 metres tall , although appears much larger in real life. It was created in homage to Leonardo Da Vinci's horse, commissioned by the Duke of Milan , but only ever completed in clay. It was destroyed when the French invaded the city around 1482 . Leonardo's creative efforts were lost but the idea for a colossal sculpture became one of the legends in the history of art. After an earlier failed attempt to recreate this horse it came to the talented animal sculptor Nina Akamu, with the help of Leonardo's sketches and drawings to bring his idea eventually to fruition . It sits among many contemporary sculptures in the park.


